LAUREL ZUCKER - BIOGRAPHY



Laurel Zucker - Flutist, is described by Gramophone Magazine in 2003 "...as polished as Galway and Rampal. In fact, Zucker's interpretations are splendid all around. Her tone is airy and sweet, her virtuosity graceful!"

In August 2003 a book published by WindPlayer Magazine, "101 Inspirational Stories from the World's Best Flute Players", Laurel Zucker is featured along with James Galway, Ian Anderson, etc.

Fanfare Magazine refers to Ms. Zucker "...as a forceful advocate for 20th-century music" and when she was awarded the prestigious Aaron Coplan Fund for Music from the American Music Center in New York City to record her 1997 CD "Take A Walk on the Wilder Side", Fanfare Magazine stated, "...this disc fills an important niche in American music as well as the flute literature."

With 26 Cantilena Records releases as of Spring 2004, Ms. Zucker is heard regularly on every U.S., Canadian European, Israeli satellite classical radio station. As a recital soloist, concerto soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player, Laurel Zucker has performed numerous times in the grand halls such as Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, Kennedy Center, Metropolitan Museum in New York City, and Mondavi Center, etcetera.

As a concerto soloist, Ms. Zucker has performed critically acclaimed performances with the Sumara Symphony Orchestra of Russia, Erkel Chamber Orchestra of Budapest, The American Symphony Orchestra of New York, Orchestra of New York, Sacramento Philharmonic, Sutter Creek Orchestra, Camellia Symphony Orchestra, Arlington Philharmonic Orchestra, etcetera.

As a chamber musician, she has performed with the Marlboro Music Festival and Tour, Tanglewood Music Festival, Harvard Chamber Player, Twin City Concert Series, University of California Davis Chamber Players, University of California Berkely Chamber Players, Music in the Mountains Festival, Chamber Music Alive!, Music Fest of Arizona, AIM Festival in Graz Austria, CHIPUM Festival in Peruggia Italy, Grand Teton Festival, FAME Festival in New Jersey, International Festival in Russia, Fountainbleau Festival in France, Monteca Kindred Arts Series, National Flute Conventions, Artist in Residence at North Carolina School of Arts, Artist in Residency at Texas Women's College in Denton Texas, arts Alive!, Public Television Show, etcetera.

During the last 10 years, Ms. Zucker was asked to be a Virtuoso Flute Artist representative of major flutemakers - Miyazawa Flutes, Powell Flutes, Straubinger Flutes, and others.

In August 2000, Dr. Bernard Fischer of the UCLA Virtual Reality Laboratory, requested the use of 3 Cantelina Records CDs featuring LAurel Zucker, for a documentary film representing a 3D computer model of the Early Christian Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore of Rome. This film was created and shown for the AUREA ROMA SHOW for Rome's Jubilee Year and at the request of the Vatican, City of Rome, and the Italian Ministry of Culture. The film played continuously from December 2000 to April 2001 in English and Italian versions in Rome at the Palace of Exhibitions - the largest major Roman facility for temporary exhibitions. The music from the Zucker CDs played continuously on all 3 floors of the Palace of Exhibitions for the other art exhibits as well.

Since 1988, Ms. Zucker is Professor of Flute at California State University in Sacramento (CSUS) where she has received numerous awards: The President's Award for Creative and Scholarly Activity 1997-1998; the CSUS Research and Creativity Awards for 1998-1999 and 2000-2001; Faculty Sponsor for the Faculty Endowment Fund Scholarly and Creativity Award 1998; Professional Promise Award 1989. In 2000, Professor Zucker was nominated for the Outstanding Teaching Award by her flute majors at CSUS and in Spring 2000, was nominated by the President of CSUS - Donald Gerth, for the prestigious Wang Family Excellence Award.

Laurel Zucker received scholarship to the Julliard School where she received her BM in 1978 for Flute Studies with Samuel Baron. She received an MA in composition with honors from New York University.

Ms. Zucker also attended New England Conservatory of Music from 1973-1975 where she studied with Paula Robinson; and privately with Marcel Moyse.



JOE GILMAN - BIOGRAPHY

JOE GILMAN hails from Northern California where he is an active musician and educator. He is a four time finalist (1997, 1998, 2000, 2002) and grand prize winner (2004) in the Great American Jazz Piano Competition and has twice been a Kennedy Center Jazz Ambassador to 12 countries on the African continent (1998, 2000).

Joe has performed professionally with Woody Shaw, Slide Hampton, Bobby Hutcherson, Dave Liebman, Eddie Harris, Marlena Shaw, Randy Brecker, John Fedchock, Bob Mintzer, Chris Botti, Bobby Shew, Charles McPherson, George Duke, Jessica Williams, and many others.

He has several recordings as a leader, including "Joe Gilman" and "Here, There, and Everywhere" for the Artful Balance label and "Treasure Chest" featuring Joe Henderson and Jeff Watts for the Timeless label. Joe's jazz repertory ensemble, Capital Jazz Project, has recorded 3 CDs for the Nefertiti label and has presented over 25 thematic concerts in Northern California.

Joe has earned music degrees from Indiana University (under the tutelage of David Baker) and the Eastman School of Music (primary studies with Bill Dobbins), and a doctorate in education from the University of Sarasota. He is currently a clinician and adjudicator in demand, and is a regular instructor at the Brubeck Institute, Jazz Camp West and American River College.

JEFF NEIGHBOR - BASSIST

Jeff Neighbor, bassist, is a highly regarded jazz/classical freelance musician. As a classical bassist he has performed with the San Francisco Symphony, SF Ballet Orchestra, SF Opera Orchestra, 21 Hollywood movie soundtracks at Skywalker Ranch in Marin, & over 50 Broadway shows.

As a jazz musician Jeff Neighbor credits include performing with Cab Callaway, Art Pepper, Bill Watrous, Kai Winding, Michelle Le Grande, Sweets Edison, Herb Ellis and Barney Kessel.

He has also performed with Joan Baez, Ray Charles, Linda Ronstadt, Chuck Berry, Maria Muldaur, Dan Hicks, The Joy of Cooking Band, and many more.

When Mr. Neighbor is not busy performing, teaching at Diablo Valley College, or working on his music publishing activities, you can find him running in Tilden Park in Berkeley Hills with his wife, Alicia, and their two dogs Ipo and Gizmo!



JIM ZIMMERMAN - PERCUSSIONIST

Jim Zimmerman graduated from the San Francisco Conservatory, then spent the following years working in the San Francisco Bay Area playing jazz, and doing recording, studio and show work.

He became staff percussionist and drummer at the Circle Star Theater where he performed with everyone from Frank Sinatra and Tony Bennett to the Temptations, Spinners, and Jackson Five.

He left the Circle Star Theater to join the legendary jazz pianist Vince Guaraldi with whom he recorded some of the Charlie Brown Peanuts specials.

In 1982, he joined the British jazz singer Cleo Laine. He recorded five albums with Cleo including the Grammy winning "Live at Carnegie" double album.

In 1992 he also started touring with jazz Grammy winner vocalist Dianne Schuur.

Jim continues to work with both artists. Putting his reading skills to work, Jim transcribed the drum examples in volumes one and two of Chuck Sher's "The New Real Book."

He has composed works for Cleo and has written pieces for vibraphone as well.
